We've Got the Power!

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." Acts 1:8 (ESV)

Somewhere amidst political correctness the church has drifted from being the daily witnesses of Jesus in fear that we might somehow offend an individual or group, but the greater tragedy is that in doing so we've offended God. When Jesus declared these words in Acts, the listeners were inspired because they knew He had endured the cross and ultimately defeated the grave.
